History

An extremely engaging and interactive speaker, Dr Katy Gibbons, Principal Lecturer in History at University of Portsmouth, joins us on zoom on 11th November to present Speaking Out Against a Tyrant: Challenging the Authority of Henry VIII.

Katy notes that Tudor society was fundamentally hierarchical, highlighting the importance of obedience. For a History audience, joining in groups or individually, we explore examples of Henry's subjects speaking out against royal policy, from rude words spoken to neighbours, to printed polemic and propaganda. Katy examines the limits to royal authority and the extent to which Henry's subjects might be seen as a threat to his power.

Criminology

Jon Garland, Professor of Criminology at University of Surrey, argues that Hate crime, whether it's the activities of the far-right, violence towards trans communities or the abuse of prominent Black footballers online, is a form of crime that's rarely out of the headlines. On 10th November, Jon explores what is unique about hate crime and asks 'how do we understand its effects?'

This important talk on zoom, suitable for Criminology, Sociology, Psychology and Law students joining in groups or individually, takes an in-depth look at hate crime victimisation, assessing its extent, forms and impact, before examining some ways hate crime can be countered.

Agriculture/Economics/Politics/Business/Geography

The UK Farming industry is rarely out of the news and, on 12th November, we bring together representatives from the National Farmers' Union and from University of East [Anglia.to](#) discuss **The Future of UK Farming**, a live debate that will encompass ideas from Agriculture, Politics, Economics, Geography and Business.

We welcome Tim Lock from the NFU who has 40 years of farming experience and is currently a Director of Red Tractor, the largest food and farm assurance scheme in the UK. Will Dickinson, also representing the NFU, is a sixth generation arable farmer

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who is regularly interviewed by the BBC about farming issues. Tim and Will will be joined on the panel by Dr Bahar Ghezelayagh, an economist from UEA who works with the Royal Norfolk Agricultural Association to explore how farming can adapt, innovate, and thrive in a changing world.

In a dynamic Question Time format, our panel will address pre-submitted and live questions from the audience.

French

Dr Constance Bantman is Head of Literature and Languages and Associate Professor in French at University of Surrey and she joins us on 11th November to explore the role of music in debates about race, language and French national identity.

Constance will examine the 'spectacular and divisive performance' by French Malian superstar singer Aya Nakamura during the Paris 2024 Olympics, noting that some saw Nakamura's medley of musical genres, languages and cultural references as a dazzling incarnation of the vibrancy of multicultural France – while many others took offence at seeing such code-breaking in front of the Académie Française.

Constance will also introduce key vocabulary and linguistic tools relating to music, culture and politics. For Languages students in groups or joining as individuals, this discussion of the deeper divisions at play in contemporary French society will be a truly compelling event.

Psychology/Biology

We welcome Dr Judith Gentle, Senior lecturer in Psychology at University of Surrey, on 13th November to present **Understanding Dyspraxia (Developmental Coordination Disorder, DCD)**.

DCD is a condition that offers fascinating insights into how the brain processes movement and perception and Judith will examine how the brain integrates information from multiple senses to build a coherent picture of the world, and how this process can easily go awry, leading to perceptual distortions and misunderstandings. Judith aims to offer a better understanding of the relationship between motor coordination, cognition, and emotion by looking at DCD through a

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psychological lens.

Maths/Statistics

In this Study Skills session, Dr Martin Bruns from UEA offers an interactive workshop for non-mathematicians/non-statisticians on **Understanding & Applying The Chi-Squared Test**.

Taking place on Zoom on 20th November and designed for groups and individuals from Social Science and Science disciplines, Martin will introduce the chi-squared test, a statistical hypothesis test used to determine if there is a significant association between what is observed and what was expected.

This is an invaluable tool to help students better understand data within their discipline and to add substance to the arguments they are presenting about such data.

Martin will use an accessible example of forecasting exchange rate movements, majoring on the transferable principles and techniques of the chi-squared test.

Essay Competition

London School of Economics' Undergraduate Political Review (LSEUPR), LSEUPR Essay Competition 2025. Our annual competition aims to encourage high school students to explore the field of Political Science and undertake university-style essay writing. It also presents itself as an ideal extra-curricular experience for students wishing to include in their UCAS personal statements.

Our essay competition is aimed at students in Year 12 and 13, or equivalent. Candidates are invited to submit an essay in response to ONE question to be chosen from the list below:

- Antonio Gramsci famously articulated that the presence of cultural hegemony produces a group he called "the subaltern," i.e., those without access to political power or representation. In today's world, where the media often reinforces dominant ideologies, to what extent can the subaltern break free from the hegemonic power in everyday life?
- To Machiavelli, the end justifies the means. Is political morality distinct from private morality?
- Do voters primarily act rationally, or are they guided more by identity and/or emotion?
- Is the United Nations still fit for purpose in the 21st century?
- Can non-democratic states provide global leadership in the 21st century?
- Is economic sovereignty possible in an age of global markets and supply chains?

The submission **deadline is Monday, 10 November 2025, 23:59 GMT**. The essay should be no more than 1,000 words long, including all in-text citations, footnotes and

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headings but excluding title and bibliography. Further details and submission specifics are outlined in the attached [Information Guide](#). All participants must consult the Information Guide and familiarise themselves with the competition specifics prior to submission.
