History

Focusing on Italy and Germany, we invite History students to join us on 2nd March to discover what recent historians have learned through comparison of these 20th Century fascist regimes.

Dr Jan Vermeiren is Associate Professor in Modern German History at UEA and will encourage students to challenge the idea of fascism as a rigid or all-powerful system by exploring its contradictions and limits.

The session also re-examines the regimes by considering their close interaction, mutual influence, and the alliance between them.

Lastly, we will consider propaganda. Jan asks how images of leadership were created, and how far they matched political and social realities.

Mathematics

Pitched for Statistics and Maths students, helping them to move beyond calculation to interpretation and critical thinking, Dr Peter Dawson from University of East Anglia will lead an interactive skills and insight workshop entitled **Thinking like a Statistician**.

Taking place on 25th February, using real world examples, Peter will explore how statisticians move from spotting patterns in data to building models that explain and predict. We consider how relationships between variables are identified and how tools such as regression help make sense of complex data. Students will be engaged in thinking about what a "relationship" really means, how other factors can influence outcomes, and why predictions are always uncertain.



Who are SMBP?

The SMBP is a volunteer-led charity bringing together over 200 professional services firms, commercial organisations and professional sports teams committed to supporting students from low-income backgrounds in their pursuit of a career, in particular, as a legal or finance professional.

What is SMBP WISE?

SMBP run WISE Weeks across the UK for eligible Year 12 and 13 students. These are 5 full days at 5 different high-profile workplaces in your area. They offer structured, skill-embedding Gatsby Benchmark-ed work experience for students from low-income backgrounds.

SMBP students:

- Participate in a week-long work insight and skills experience in which they are given the opportunity to spend a day at four different businesses.
- Attend a day run by a professional sports club to learn about the psychology of resilience and goal achievement models.
- Have access to virtual Career Mentoring from legal, accountancy and business professionals. Our volunteers are on hand to help with creating Personal Statements/CVs, compiling application forms, and preparing for interviews.
