Dear Parent/Carer,

Re: Results Day (Year 13 – 14.08.25 / Year 11 – 21.08.25)

I hope this letter finds you well. I would like to take this opportunity to clarify arrangements, for students in both Years 11 and 13, to receive their GCSE and A-Level Results, which I hope you will find helpful.

We are inviting students into school to collect their examination results on the following dates:

Level 3 Results (A Levels and equivalents)

Level 2 Results (GCSEs and equivalents)

Thursday 14 August 2025

Thursday 21 August 2025

All Year 11 and 13 students are welcome to come into school to collect their results in person, and to celebrate their achievements and the culmination of many years of dedication, determination, and resilience.

Results are collected from the ECO area between 8:00am and 10:30am. Throughout both mornings members of staff will be available to offer advice and guidance where necessary.

We understand that some students may not be able to collect their results in person. To accommodate this, results can be collected on a student's behalf by a nominated family member or representative. If a student wishes for someone else to collect their results, they must email the Examinations Manager, Mrs. J Manning, at exams@plymstockschool.org.uk, giving permission and clearly naming the person who will collect them.

The person collecting their results will need to bring:

- A signed letter from the student authorising them to collect your results
- Valid photo identification

Alternatively, results can be sent to a student's school email account upon request. Please note that results cannot be given out over the phone.

How parents can help

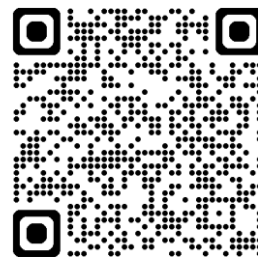
At this point most students will need your reassurance that whatever the results turn out to be they will have your unconditional support and respect and life will, somehow, turn out to be fine whatever happens on Results Day. Whilst we all hope that our students have achieved excellent results that give them the options they are hoping for, it may be useful to remind them often over the next few weeks that success in life is never determined solely by academic achievements, and is rarely limited by them. Talking through the different possible outcomes and working out a plan for the worst-case scenario can help prevent a disappointment from turning into a catastrophe. Whatever happens there will always be choices to make and these choices are easier to consider before the emotions that results day can bring.
