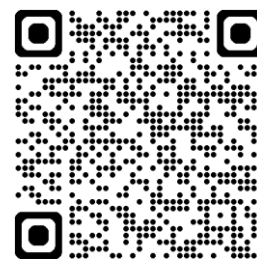
Dear Parent/Carer,

RE: YEAR 10 PROGRESS CHECK

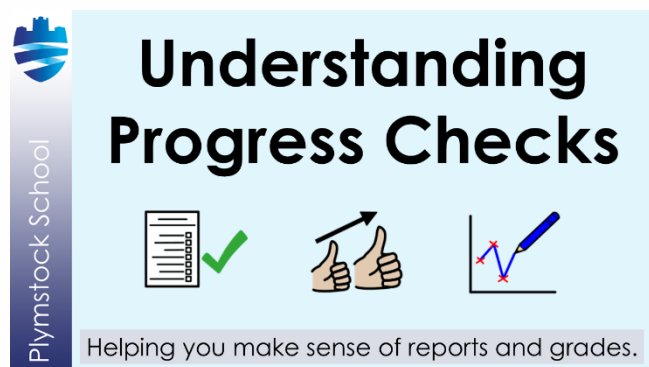

These resources are designed to help make sense of the report and explain how rank ordering works; a method that reflects how GCSE grades are awarded nationally. Our goal is to share clear, meaningful feedback that supports your child's learning journey.

We are providing rank order information to offer a clearer understanding of performance relative to peers within the cohort. GCSE grades 9-1 are assigned using rank order based on the performance of all children in England sitting the same exam. Please be assured that all the information we share is intended to support your child's progress. Rank order data is used to celebrate success and identify areas for support, enabling us to work together to help every student achieve their full potential.

We're looking forward to seeing you at our Year 11 Parent Information Evening (date and details to follow), which will take place early in the Autumn term. This event will outline what to expect in the year ahead and how we'll be supporting students through their final GCSE year.
